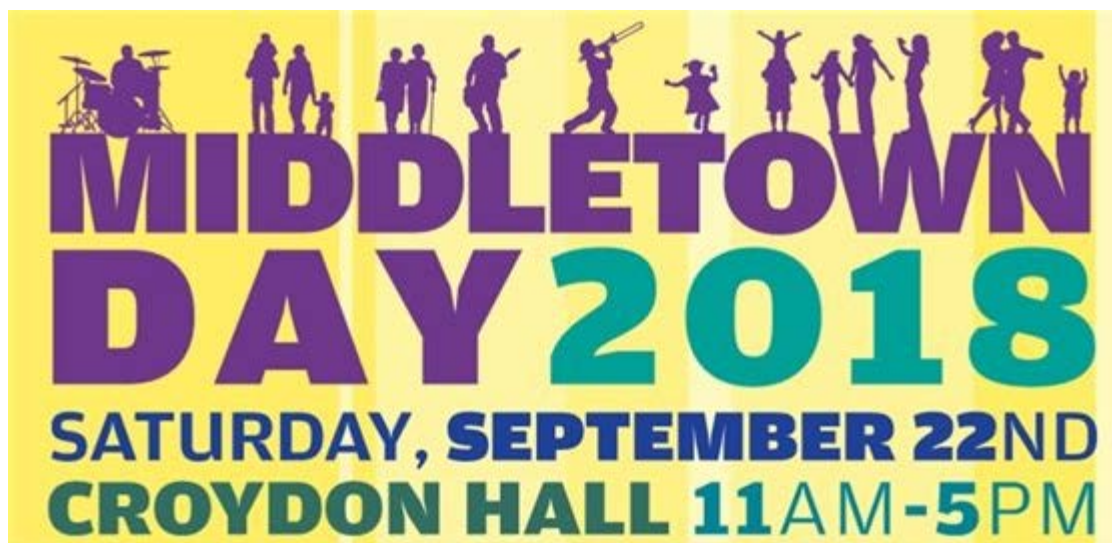


Join Us for Middletown Day this Saturday, 9/22!

Middletown Raises POW/MIA Flag at Thorne Middle School on National POW/MIA Day



On Friday, September 21st Mayor Kevin Settembrino, Middletown Township Committee members Tony Perry and Pat Snell, members of the Veterans Affairs Committee (VAC), VFW Post 2179, Freeholder Gerry Scharfenberger, and Hazlet Deputy Mayor Sue Kiley came together to recognize [National POW/MIA Day](#) by raising the POW/MIA flag for the first time at Thorne Middle School. The ceremony took place in front of the Corporal Horace M. "Buddy" Thorne Monument which was dedicated in honor of the school's namesake, local World War II hero Buddy Thorne, who sacrificed his life for our country at the Battle of the Bulge in 1944. Thorne Middle School Principal, Tom Olausen, and Corporal Thorne's sisters, Verna Mauro and Anita Keyser, were also in attendance.

The VAC has been working with the Board of Education and VFW Post 2179 for several months to have POW/MIA flags raised at all 17 public schools across the Township. After receiving approval from the Board of Education, the VAC reached out to VFW 2179 who raised over \$600 to purchase the flags. Veterans Affairs Committee President Dennis Beauregard presented the flags to Assistant Superintendent Mary Ellen Walker to be hung at all schools going forward.

Middletown Celebrates Ground Breaking for Green Roof Pavilion at Poricy Park



On Monday September 17th, Township officials and members of the Poricy Park Conservancy attended a ground breaking for the Green Roof Pavilion at Poricy Park.

Last year, Middletown Township was awarded a \$20,000 Sustainable Jersey grant funded by the PSE&G Foundation to construct a green pavilion with a living roof in Poricy Park.

This modular green roof will have various forms of vegetation including an irrigation system.

The pavilion will be used as an outdoor classroom for children to learn about the positive impact that green infrastructure has on long-term sustainability. The grant funds, along with a donation from the Poricy Park Conservancy and Township monies, will enable the Township to move forward with these plans.

Since the dog was exposed to the animal, the raccoon was sent to the State Laboratory for testing. The raccoon came from the area near South Lake Drive and Nut Swamp Road. The Monmouth County Clerk's Office will begin the process of notifying all vote by mail voters from the 2016 presidential election (who have not requested a ballot for the 2018 election) that they will be receiving a ballot unless they **opt out in writing**. The County Clerk's Office is sending out approximately 25,000 of these letters.

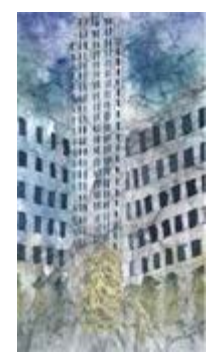


