Middletown Township Committee Seeks Voters' Support to Increase Open Space



The Middletown Township Committee unanimously supported a resolution at the Monday, July 20th Regular Meeting to include a referendum on the November 2020 General Election Ballot to amend the dedicated Open Space Trust annual collection rate from \$.02 to \$.03 per \$100 in equalized valuation.

The Middletown Open Space Trust was established by the voters of Middletown in 1998 with a dedicated tax levy of \$.01 per \$100 in equalized valuation to ensure that the Township would be able to fund acquisitions and improvements to open space and parkland properties. In 2002, voters supported an amendment to an annual collection rate of \$.02 per \$100 in equalized valuation.

“As we look toward Middletown’s future, we must act to ensure that we preserve as much of our undeveloped land as possible, so now we ask the community for their support and vote to help us save it,” said Mayor Tony Perry. “All of us have the opportunity to preserve the Middletown we hope to pass along to the next generation.”

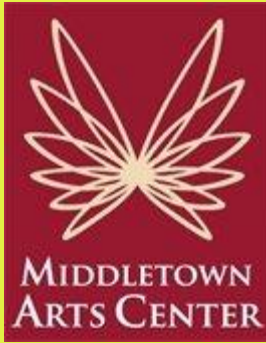

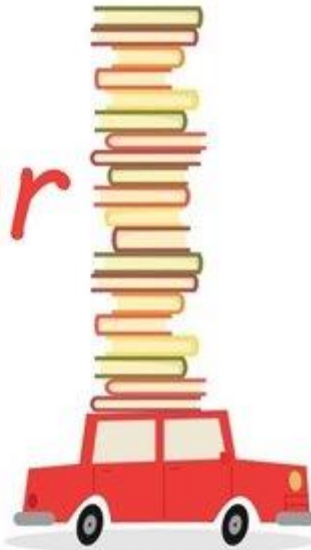
Summer Concert Series at the MAC Postponed

Outdoor Pickup



We are open to the public and outdoor pickup is still available. If you are interested in using our outdoor pickup services:

- ◆ Place item on hold.
- ◆ Upon receiving notification items are ready, pickup is Monday-Friday 9:00 am - 4:00 pm with additional hours Wednesday until 8:00 pm.
- ◆ When arriving at the library, call 732-671-3700 ext. 320. Tell us you are here for outdoor pickup, giving your last name and library card number. Meet us under the front entrance canopy to collect your checked-out items.
- ◆ Patrons have 7 days from notification to pick up items.

Wednesdays 9a-9p

The patio will open for August!

DVDs check-out: 7 days, and may be renewed for 2 days. New DVDs check-out is still only 2 days. Other materials are checking out for three-weeks, with a 2-week renewal. Fines are being collected for late items (remember items are back-dated because of quarantine.) Computers are on, patrons need to sign in at reference to use them. All returns are quarantined for 3 days before being checked in.

What is the recommendation for wearing a face covering/mask inside while patronizing a business?

According to the New Jersey Department of Health, accommodations can be made if someone is not able to wear a face mask due to a medical condition. Essential businesses that never closed (e.g. a grocery store or a pharmacy) cannot refuse entry to someone who has a medical condition and can't wear mask. They may offer options, such as to provide curbside delivery and limit time spent inside store, but the person must be allowed to enter.

If the person doesn't have a medical condition, but refuses to wear a mask, essential businesses *can* refuse entry but must arrange curbside delivery or provide a mask, if available. No one can be asked for medical documentation due to various laws that already existed, so people do not need to "prove" why they can't wear a mask.

MINIMIZING THE RISK OF COVID-19

The spread of COVID-19 can be broken down into four factors: TIME, SPACE, PEOPLE & PLACE.



Keeping these factors in mind can help you assess your risk while participating in activities.

Minimizing the Risk of COVID-19

- Limit capacity, especially indoors
- Social distance from others (6 feet)
- Avoid crowded areas
- Choose outside activities vs. inside (dining, worship services, etc.)
- Don't share food/drink, cups or utensils with others; bring your own or use disposable items at outdoor gatherings
- Wear face coverings in public areas
- Wash hands often or use hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol

Singing, yelling/shouting and close contact increase the risk of contracting COVID-19.
