## CDC Guidelines for Celebrating the Thanksgiving Holiday in a Safe Way

Traditional Thanksgiving gatherings with family and friends are fun but can increase the chances of getting or spreading COVID-19 or the flu. Follow these tips to make your Thanksgiving holiday safer.

The safest way to celebrate Thanksgiving this year is to celebrate with people in your household. If you do plan to spend Thanksgiving with people outside your household, take steps to make your celebration safer.

### Everyone Can Make Thanksgiving Safer

**Wear a mask**

- Wear a mask with two or more layers to stop the spread of COVID-19.
- Wear the mask over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin.
- Make sure the mask fits snugly against the sides of your face.

**Stay at least 6 feet away from others who do not live with you**

- Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread COVID-19 or flu.
- Keeping 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths) from others is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

**Wash your hands**

- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Keep hand sanitizer with you and use it when you are unable to wash your hands.
- Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

This new field is a welcome supplement to the turf field built by the Township Committee on school property in 2013. These twin fields, both with full sports lighting, will provide children with a place to play soccer, football, and lacrosse day and night for years to come. Meanwhile, on the main Normandy Park property, new synthetic turf fields are still under construction and nearing completion. These new baseball and soccer fields will also allow for games to be played under the lights. New parking and lighting is also planned for the site with project completion set for the end of the year!

**NEW FOR 2020:**  
The Fall 2020 Leaf Collection Schedule has been consolidated into three zones (see chart). Collection dates of individual zones may vary. Please note there will be only one collection in each zone.

**LEAF COLLECTION ONLY – NO BRUSH UNTIL SPRING!**  
DO NOT SET OUT LEAVES AFTER YOUR ZONE HAS BEEN COLLECTED - Violators will be charged up to \$1,250 for a separate individual collection. Do not place material at the curb earlier than 7 days before your zone's start date as it creates a hazard for pedestrians & drivers. Brush, tree stumps, lumber, plywood, fence posts, railroad ties, or garbage will not be collected. Residents can bring leaves to the Middletown Recycling Center from Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> until June 1<sup>st</sup>. Brush is accepted year-round.

**Why You Can't Test Out of COVID-19 Quarantine\*** 

\*Quarantine = staying home/away from others for 14 days after close contact with someone with COVID-19 to make sure you don't get sick/infect others.

<p>Possibly exposed to COVID-19?</p> 	<p>Quarantine at home for 14 days.</p> 	<p>You cannot test out of quarantine.</p> 	<p>Even if you test negative, stay home for 14 days.</p> 
<p>A negative test only shows you are not infected on the day tested during the 14 day quarantine.</p> 	<p>You can still test positive and/or become sick during the 14 day quarantine.</p> 	<p>It is important to complete the entire 14 day quarantine.</p> 	<p>After 14 days if you have no symptoms, your quarantine is over.</p>

## NJ Poison Control Center Warns Community About Potential Misuse of Hand Sanitizers

In the COVID-19 era, alcohol-based hand sanitizers are not just a household staple, they are an everyday necessity. Since becoming part of our daily defense against coronavirus infection, these products are kept just about everywhere — from vehicles to handbags/backpacks to lunchboxes. Although hand sanitizers play an important role in preventing infection and slowing the spread of COVID-19, these products can result in potentially serious health consequences. In fact, hand sanitizers carry a potential for misuse, abuse and accidental exposure which can lead to alcohol overdose (poisoning).
